- Repaired leaking fuel bowl on the Green Tractor.

- Washed, dried, and folded several loads of kitchen linen.
- Replaced depleted can of Fix-A-Flat.
- Tightened loose washers on main Kitchen sink faucets.

**SUGGESTED TASKS FOR THE JULY ACTIVITY WEEKEND:**

- Cut down a dead tree adjacent to the Pole Barn. This job involves temporarily taking down and reinstalling the public address wire between the Pole Barn and Walk-In Cooler.
- Cut up and haul to the wood pile the previously cut down tree located across the road from the Bunkhouse.

**PROJECTS LOOKING FOR A COORDINATOR & HELPING HANDS:**

**Walk-In Cooler Door Seal Replacement:** The previous plan to replace the seals suggested removing the old seals and replacing them by drilling out the old rivets securing the flanges holding the seals in place and blind riveting the flanges in back in place to secure the new seals. Probably because this plan required the use of specialized tools and uncommon technical skills, no takers stepped forward to accomplish this task.

Therefore an alternative plan of accomplishment has been proposed to simplify the process and eliminate the need for special tools and skills. The new plan is to find a commercial business capable of removing and replacing the seals then transporting the four doors there for seal replacement. Since the Walk-In Cooler is in continuous use and cannot be turned off, it is proposed that one door at a time be taken off, taken serially for seal replacement, and a plywood close out panel be put in place while each door is away.
