CARRYOVER PROJECT LOOKING FOR A COORDINATOR & HELPING HANDS:

Walk-In Cooler Door Seal Replacement: The previous plan to replace the seals suggested removing the old seals and replacing them by drilling out the old rivets securing the flanges holding the seals in place and blind riveting the flanges in back in place to secure the new seals. Probably because this plan required the use of specialized tools and uncommon technical skills, no takers stepped forward to accomplish this task. Therefore, an alternative plan of accomplishment has been proposed to simplify the process and eliminate the need for special tools and skills. The new plan is to find a commercial business capable of removing and replacing the seals then transporting the four doors there for seal replacement. Since the Walk-In Cooler is in continuous use and cannot be turned off, it is proposed that one door at a time be taken off, taken serially for seal replacement, and a plywood close out panel be put in place while each door is away.
